
JANUS

The title of this newsletter comes from an ancient god of Roman mythology. Janus was a god of two faces, one young and one old; one face to see the future, the other to see the past. The name Janus, then, should apply to the Fossil Club, which looks to the past for clues to the future, and also to this newsletter, which will be (with your support) the beginning of something good.

NEW BOARD ELECTED

The annual meeting of the North Carolina Fossil Club was held at the Museum of Natural History in Raleigh on Saturday, November 17th, for the purpose of electing a new Board of Directors. Vince Schneider was declared President by acclamation after no other nominees were proposed. He replaces Ed Womble, who chose not to run for re-election. Four other club members were elected for two-year terms as directors; these were Ed Womble, Bob Baldridge, Annette Seymour, and Leland Whittle. Grace Peacock was elected for a one-year term to fill the vacancy left by Vince Schneider.

Other club business handled at this meeting included discussion on a proposal that the Board of Directors be increased from eight members to twelve. This proposal was defeated, however, so the Board membership remains at eight. Another proposal was heard that a trip to the Smithsonian Institution be planned for every other

year. All members present approved and decided that, since no trip was made this year, a trip would be planned for 1980. A third proposal was submitted and approved that the club adopt a new logo (which appears on this newsletter) to represent our club on letterheads, ID buttons, and other official paraphernalia.

The new President, Vince Schneider, called a Board meeting immediately following the club meeting. Since Board meetings are open to all members, all were invited to stay. A report on this meeting and other club news is on page two.

REPORT ON ANNUAL BOARD MEETING

Newly elected president Vince Schneider began the board meeting by having the board members vote on the nominees for Vice President, Secretary, and Treasurer. Results were:

Vice-President - Bob Baldridge Secretary - Judy Raynor Treasurer - John Everette The treasurer will also serve as membership chairman.

After the voting was over, John Everette expressed the sincere thanks of everyone present to Ed Womble for his outstanding leadership and contributions as outgoing president of the Fossil Club.

The next order of business was to set membership dues for 1980. The dues will remain the same as last year:

Before closing, the board set a date for the next board meeting, to be held on January 19th, 1980, at 10:00, at the Museum of Natural History in Raleigh. This meeting is open to all Fossil Club members and all are urged to attend. The agenda for this meeting will include the scheduling of fossil trips for next year, as well as discussion on car-pooling to fossil sites, new fossil localities, the possibility of out-of-state fossil trips, guest policies, and the organization of educational programs of interest to Fossil Club members. A membership application is printed on page 3 for both new and renewing members to fill out and return with their 1980 dues.

3)Car-Pooling - for readers who are interested in sharing rides to trips and meetings.Other ideas, or comments on these,

are welcome.

We would also like to know when any of our members finds a particularly interesting fossil or makes a donation to a museum. Photographs of well-preserved specimens may be printed to help members identify and sort their own collections.
